It provides for your Estate to be managed in the way *You* wish it to be. And it ensures that the right people who *You* have chosen receive what you would like them to, and not having this decision left to unknown persons and/or the State.

This document has been prepared in order to comfortably guide you through details required for the preparation of your Will. You are encouraged to think carefully about each of your answers. Should you have any difficulty in answering any of the questions, leave blank and we will guide you further on how to complete these areas.

Preparation of Your Will

Before you start to complete this form you will need the following:

- ✓ The names of the people, institutions, charities etc that you may wish to have inherit any part of your Estate
- ✓ The names of the people you may wish to look after your Estate

You may also need

- ✓ The names of the people you wish to look after your children should they be minors
- ✓ If you have special items, gifts that you wish to expressly give you will need a list of these items.
